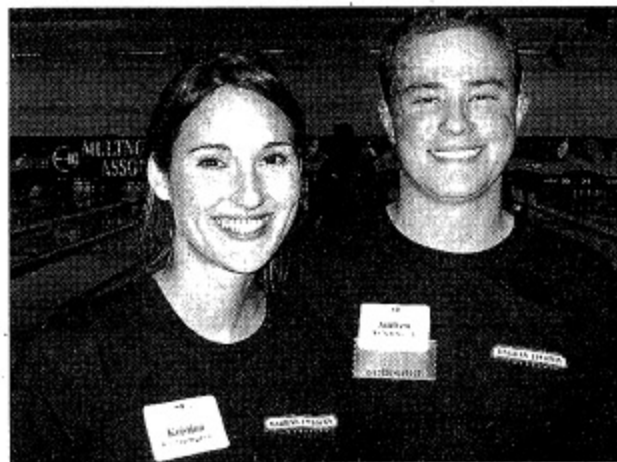


OREGON ARCHAEOLOGICAL SOCIETY
