



The mission of the MBA's Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Committee is to foster and expand diversity, inclusion and equality in the Multnomah County legal community and to create and strengthen a relationship of mutual support between the MBA and its diverse lawyers and bar organizations. In furtherance of this goal, the Committee is joining forces with the Oregon State Bar in awarding scholarships for law school applicants who will enhance the diversity of our legal community. The scholarships will be applied toward an online PowerScore LSAT preparation course.

This scholarship is open to any person who intends to apply to law school and ultimately practice law in the state Oregon. Preference will be given to those who, either (a) are currently attending college in the state of Oregon or Vancouver, Washington; or (b) have substantial ties to the state of Oregon. Applicants should apply for this scholarship only if they can commit to completing a rigorous LSAT preparation course. Classes preparing students for the June 2019 test date begin in early April and last 6-8 weeks. Each session runs 3-4 hours, and there are 2-4 sessions per week.
